## MUST SEE RACING TEAMS /US TRAVELERS

Travel and identification documents for entering Canada

---

A border services officer will determine whether you can enter Canada when you arrive by confirming your identity and your US citizenship or permanent residency status.

### UNITED STATES CITIZENS

To prove your identity and citizenship, regardless of age, the **CBSA RECOMMENDS TRAVELING WITH A VALID PASSPORT.**

However, you may also present documents that show your:

- full name
- date of birth
- citizenship

If one document doesn't include all of this information, you can use a combination of documents. If your proof of citizenship does not include a photo, you may be asked to provide a separate photo ID.

Examples of valid documents including:

- valid passport from your country of nationality
- birth certificate
- certificate of citizenship or naturalization
- certificate of Indian status along with photo identification

## **TRAVELING WITH CHILDREN AND MINORS**

When travelling with a minor (under 18 years of age), you should:

- carry acceptable identification for the minor
  - documents required for [residents returning to Canada](#)
  - documents required for [US travellers](#) (US citizens and permanent residents)
  - documents required for [international travellers](#) (other than US)
- carry copies of any legal custody documents, such as custody rights, if applicable
- arrive at the border in the same vehicle as the minor
- carry a consent letter if:
  - you share custody of the minor and the other parent or legal guardian is not travelling with you
  - you are not the parent or legal guardian of the minor

A consent letter must include the custodial parents' or legal guardians':

- full name
- address
- telephone number

Border services officers are always watching for missing children and may ask questions about minors travelling with you. To avoid delays, have your consent letter notarized to support its authenticity.

In response to your correspondence dated February 4<sup>th</sup>, 2026; the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) - International Events and Convention Services Program (IECSP) officially recognizes the following event:

**Must See Racing Series**  
**August 7<sup>th</sup>, 2026**  
**Delaware Speedway**  
**Delaware, Ontario**

The information provided to the CBSA states there will be approximately 2500 attendees to which 10% are foreign to Canada and that the event is open to the general public with sales.

As outlined in your correspondence, this event is expecting approximately 16 foreign competitors who are importing racing vehicles and team equipment for use at the event.

It should be noted that, non-Canadian exhibitors may import race vehicles and equipment temporarily as outlined in the provisions of tariff classification **9993.00.00.00** duty free, on the condition that the goods will be exported from Canada upon the completion of the event.

Please be advised that the racing vehicles, trailers and conveyances for moving such vehicles into and from Canada, repair parts and repair equipment such as tires, wheels, spare parts, tools, portable shop equipment, etc. required to maintain the imported racing vehicles while in Canada, are permitted temporary entry under this Tariff Item. Fuel in excess of the normal tank capacity of the racing vehicles, oil, grease, and other consumables are subject to payment of duties and taxes at time of importation into Canada. Listings of goods being imported should be prepared indicating description, quantity and values.

Goods imported for sale are not eligible under tariff No. 9993.00.00.00. These goods must be accounted for at time of release on a Commercial Accounting Document (CAD). Commercial release processing is fully explained in Customs Memorandum D17-1-5.

Goods imported as “giveaways” must be accounted for at time of release on a Commercial Accounting Document (CAD) with all applicable duties and/or taxes collected at the time of importation.

Under certain circumstances, the CBSA will require a security deposit on goods temporarily imported to Canada. These goods are normally documented on the Temporary Admission Permit (Form BSF865).

At the time of exportation, goods granted temporary admission on a Form BSF865 or Carnet must be presented along with importer’s/owner’s copies of the appropriate documentation to CBSA for verification and certification.

**Canada**

This presentation may occur at a CBSA office inland or at the port of export, depending on the circumstances involved and is necessary for you to receive a refund of any securities posted. Please note that the refund may not be immediate.

There is no official customs broker appointed for this event. It is understood, if required; participants will appoint their own customs broker.

CBSA requires everyone seeking admission into Canada to properly declare themselves to CBSA by providing accurate identification. CBSA will accept a valid passport as proof of citizenship.

Persons who have been convicted of any criminal offences may be inadmissible to Canada. Visa-exempt foreign nationals, excluding U.S. citizens, now require an Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) to fly to or transit through Canada. If you are arriving at one of Canada's main airports ([www.cbsa-asfc.gc.ca/services/border-tech-frontiere/pik-bjp-eng.html](http://www.cbsa-asfc.gc.ca/services/border-tech-frontiere/pik-bjp-eng.html)), you can complete your customs and immigration declaration at an airport kiosk or eGate upon arrival.

Save time and submit an Advance Declaration ([www.canada.ca/en/border-services-agency/services/arrivecan.html](http://www.canada.ca/en/border-services-agency/services/arrivecan.html)), up to 72 hours before you arrive in Canada. This allows you to do so at your own pace, and in a preferred environment. Special access to express lanes in the arrivals hall will be given to travellers who have used this feature.

You may then retrieve your declaration by scanning your travel document and confirming your identity at an airport kiosk or eGate before presenting yourself to a border services officer.

All passengers arriving at other airports must fill out a paper E311 CBSA Declaration Card prior to arrival and present it to a border services officer.

**To facilitate border procedures during entry into Canada, each participant should have a copy of this letter and be in possession of an itemized list of articles stating description, quantity and value for presentation to CBSA officials.**
